### THE EAST ST. LOUIS TERMINAL

The East St. Louis Terminal extends from alle post 329 to mile post 337 of the St. Louis Division and is the Western Terminus of the Chessie System. The Terminal consists of two yards: Cone Yard and Lower Yard.

### CONE YARD

Cone Yard was rebuilt from a small yard and enlarged and put into service in 1946. Cone Yard is divided in two for purpose of receiving and dispatching trains and for general switching.

The South Yard is for general switching, make up and dispatchment of Eastward trains and the North Yard is for general switching, receiving of interchange cars and receiving Westward trains.

#### LOWER YARD

Lower yard consists of 33 tracks, 13 of which are used for loading and unloading of Tofcee business. House track #1, adjacent to Chessie freight house, is used to spot cars for Eldridge Drayage Company who handles the unloading of empty bottles for Anheuser Busch, Inc.

Tracks Cahokia #1, 2 and 3 join to form running track thru lower yard and allow us to go to the Wiggins Yard of the Terminal Railroad Association.

Tracks 26 and 27 are used for interchange of cars with the Illinois Central Gulf Co.
